Task: Develop a proposal to be presented to the L.T.D.T.C. Board of Directors defining a plan for Top Team Awards for Agility that would be given at the Annual Awards Dinner.

Method: Using the rules established for the Obedience Title Top Dog Awards presented annually, develop a plan for Agility awards, considering similarities and differences in the two disciplines.

Auxiliary Task: Since Rally teams also do not have an annual recognition, develop an award proposal for Rally as well. Task assumed by Roxanne Dwyer and Erin Rezmer.

Timing: Develop and seek approval from Board in time to present 2011 Awards at the February, 2012 Award Dinner.

Proposal: Lyons Township Dog Training Club Annual "Top Rally Team" Awards

Three Top Rally Team awards will be given annually, one each at the Novice, Advanced, and Excellent levels.

At each level, all club members in good standing who post AKC Sanctioned Rally Competition scores in the Club Brag Book will be eligible for this award. Top Rally Team awards will be determined by averaging the scores from the three legs that earned the title during the current year. Individual first and second legs toward the title may have been earned in previous years. In the case of a tie, a duplicate award will be issued to both teams.

The Director of Training will appoint an individual to verify entries in the Brag Book to determine candidates for these awards, and will approve proposed award winners prior to presentation to the L.T.D.T.C. Board of Directors. The approved awards will be presented at the Annual Awards Dinner.

The inaugural awards will be presented for 2011 at the February, 2012, Annual Awards Dinner.

Considerations for Top Agility Team Awards

Obedience has only one event, Agility has three, Standard, Jumpers with Weaves, and FAST. We decided to make the number of titles won during the year the primary concern at each level (Novice, Open, and Excellent). Three titles are better than two, two are better than one. Highest average score is the tiebreaker.

Obedience has only one competition group in events. Agility has two competition groups, Regular and Preferred, in each event. We decided to recognize both as candidates for the same award, since both earn the same Green Ribbon for "Q"s from the AKC, and the Club has recognized both at the Annual Awards Dinner.

Agility competitors could earn titles in both the Regular and Preferred competition groups. We decided to recognize only the first title earned at each level. We feel that the Top Agility Team Award should be for "First Time" teams at each level. Thus a team may begin its trial career at either the regular or preferred level, and would be eligible for this award for the first title earned in Novice, Open or Excellent.

FAST Agility competitions are scored with a maximum possible score of 80, versus a maximum score of 100 in Standard and Jumpers with Weaves. We decided to develop a mathematical table (see next page) to equalize the score for FAST.

It is the responsibility of club members to enter qualifying runs in the Brag Book in a timely and accurate manner. Only titles completed during the current calendar year are eligible for the current year Top Agility Team Award. First and second legs toward a title may have been earned in a previous year. Also, any missing information for a qualifying run that cannot be otherwise verified disqualifies that leg from Top Agility Team Award consideration.

Obedience has Top Dog Awards for the highest scoring team at the CD, CDX, and UD levels. Similarly, we propose that Top Agility Team Awards should be given at the Novice, Open, and Excellent levels. We also propose that **ALL** competitors who achieve a Masters level title should be given a Special Recognition Award, for attaining ten perfect scores on Excellent level courses.

(Extending this logic, **ALL** competitors in Obedience who achieve a UDX title should also receive a Special Recognition Award.)

Proposal: Lyons Township Dog Training Club Annual "Top Agility Team" Awards

Three "Top Agility Team" awards will be given annually, one each at the Novice, Open, and Excellent A levels.

The awards will be based on performance in AKC Standard, Jumpers with Weaves, and FAST competitions (1).

At each level, all club members in good standing who post AKC Sanctioned Agility Competition scores in the Club Brag Book will be eligible for this award. The club member at each level with the most AKC Agility Titles at that level earned during the current year will be considered for the award(2). First and second legs toward the titles can be earned during previous years. When there are multiple club members with the same number of AKC Agility titles at a level, the three qualifying scores for each title will be added together and averaged, with the award going to the team with the highest average score. If a tie still exists, there will be duplicate awards issued.

The Director of Training will appoint an individual to verify entries in the Brag Book to determine candidates for these awards, and will approve proposed award winners prior to presentation to the L.T.D.T.C. Board of Directors. The approved awards will be presented at the Annual Awards Dinner.

The inaugural awards will be presented for 2011 at the February, 2012, Annual Awards Dinner.

- (1) FAST scores will be modified per the attached table, in order to compensate for the difference in possible score achievement in this competition.
- (2) Once an agility team has qualified at a level in any of the agility disciplines, that team will not be eligible later in that same discipline with a title in a preferred category, or the opposite.
